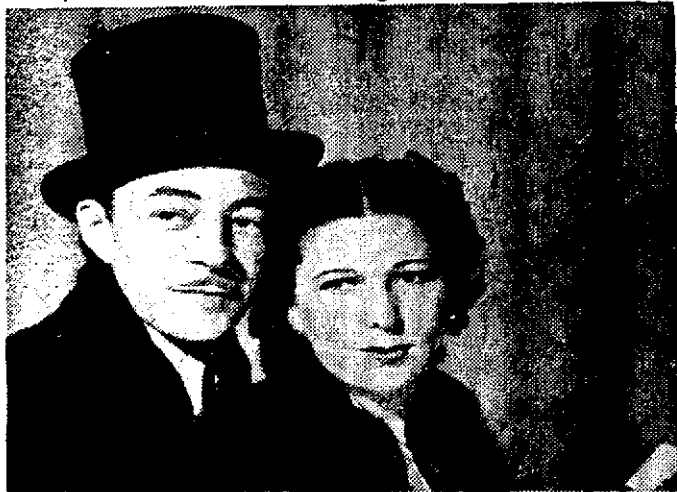


They Present 'First Nighter'
