MYSTERY BLAZE BREAKS OUT IN CAROLINA PORT

WILMINGTON, N. C., Dec. 8 (INS) - A mysterious fire broke out today on a barge filled with high test gasoline and immediately was communicated to a large tanker, the H. N. Friedrichsen, owned by the Pure Oil company, also loaded with gasoline.

The fire was extinguished after a two-hour fight. Agents of the federal bureau of investigation were dispatched to the ships lying at their Wilmington dock to search for evidence of sabotage.
