BREEDS GREEN MICE

LONDON, Dec. 22 — (INS) —
After breeding 50 generations of
mice, Dr. Rosslyn Bruce, rector of
Hurstmonceaux, Sussex, has suc-
ceeded in breeding green speci-
mens. The first of these was grass
green, and its first offspring was
bottle green. Now he has the first
family from the bottle green
mouse. Their "chief tendency" is
back to grass green, but two of
the family are white — the first
sign of the original Japanese white
strain for many generations.
