From New York the program will present Alec Templeton, Sabu—the "Elephant Boy," Fredric March, Florence Eldridge, Allan Reed, Tito Guizar, Barry Wood, Graham McNamee, Larry Elliott and Tom Jones conducting the Treasury Hour Orchestra and Choir.

Betty Hutton, irrepressible jitterbug who has made three guest appearances on Bob Hope's program, will become a regular member of the cast with the WEAF broadcast of Tuesday at 10:00 p. m. She has been signed for thirteen weeks as comedienne and singer.

Horace Heidt's orchestra, continuing a custom of the past several years, will use miniature instruments for the featured number in their pre-Christmas broadcast Tuesday over WEAF at 8:30 p. m. The song will be "The Toy Trumpet Finale," climactic tune in the "Treasure Chest" lineup.

Martha Tilton will salute the boys in the army with the song titled, "He's 1-A in the Army, But He's A-1 In My Heart," on the Fibber McGee and Molly program Tuesday, 9:30 p. m. via WEAF. The King's Men will sing "What Do I Want For Christmas," and
