"Headlines of 1941," the 10 biggest news stories of the year, will be radio's highlight tonight at 8 through WIBA. The stories selected for dramatization are:

ONE: The coup d'etat in Yugoslavia and the subsequent German invasion of Yugoslavia, Greece and Crete.

TWO: The flight of Rudolf Hess to Great Britain.

THREE: The sinking of the Hood and the Bismarck in one of the world's greatest naval actions.

FOUR: American occupation of Iceland.

FIVE: Germany's invasion of Russia.

SIX: The sea meeting of Pres. Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill at which the "Atlantic Charter" was drafted.

SEVEN: Pres. Roosevelt's "shoot on sight" command to the navy and the subsequent sinking of the Reuben James and incidents involving the Greer and Kearney.

EIGHT: The military campaign in Libya.

NINE: The "V for Victory" campaign and its attendant sabotage and noncooperation in the conquered nations.

TEN: America's entrance into the war.
