

# e Army, Navy t Line' Show

Men of the United States army and navy will be saluted by radio tonight.

Bing Crosby and his Music Hall crew will pay tribute to those men who man the coast defense and anti-aircraft guns when they "initiate" a Ft. MacArthur officer in their broadcast at 8 over WIBA. Robert Young of the films will be the show's guest, too.

At 9:15, "The First Line" will point to the navy, with Admiral Richard E. Byrd as its guest. The WBBM program will dramatize incidents off the coast of Tripoli, in European waters, in the south seas, and in the Far East.

The story of the army's rescue flight to Chile during the 1939 earthquake will be told in "Americans at the Ramparts" over WGN at 7. William Gaxton, of "Louisiana Purchase," will be master of ceremonies in the music-and-drama program.
