

# Networks Will Unite For 'America At War' Program

New Show Has 13-Week Booking And Will  
Feature Many Guest Stars Who  
Donate Services

For the first time on record, all four networks are to combine for a weekly series of broadcasts. The objective will be dramatization and interpretation of the wartime resources and activities of Uncle Sam in cooperation with the government.

The time has been selected as 7 o'clock Saturday nights, with a repeat at 12:45 for the far west. February 14, is the starting date under a 13-week schedule. Title of the opener is "America At War."

The network combination will bring together more than 500 stations, with short wave relays to English as well as translations to other languages to make the audience world wide. The four chains, NBC, CBS, Blue and MBS, will share in the expense, while talent services will be contributed, with numerous stars expected to participate in the half-hour show.

A man who has collected musical instruments from all parts of the world and duplicated them in clay form will be a guest star on Dave Elman's popular "Hobby Lobby" program, Saturday at 8:30 over WABC. The musical hobbyist, William J. Kugler, of Minneapolis, traveled extensively in Europe, collecting many ancient instruments from various sections of the continent. These he could not buy, Kugler made.

All of the instruments can be played, as Kugler will prove when he brings his quaint collection to the broadcast.

Another interesting hobbyist will be Mrs. George Stern, of Washington, D. C., who collects queer minerals and odd facts con-

nected with them. Mrs. Stern will bring an assortment of unusual minerals with her to the broadcasting studio.

Benny Goodman, renowned master of jive and jump, who doubles in Bach and Beethoven for Town hall chamber music recitals, appears as Bill Stern's guest on the sports Newsreel of the air Saturday, at 10:00 p. m. over WEAJ.
