Complete approved transmitter construction and m-stallation was made this week by the Federal Communications com-mission in Washington, D. C. This approval carried the full author-ity to begin broadcasting on the higher power at night, thus mak-ing WIBA a Class III-A regional station with 5,000 watts power day and night. During tonight's dedication pro-gram, WIBA listeners will hear a description of the new trans-mitter and the scene at the trans-mitter as the power is stepped up from 500 to 5,000 watts.
