

Two Guest Experts To Be On "Information Please"

Julian Huxley, Scientist, And Jan Struther, Author, To Match Wits With Fadiman Along With Kieran And Adams

"Information Please" will present a 50-50 British-American front against Clifton Fadiman's blast of questions in the broadcast session of Friday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAF. Julian Huxley, eminent scientist, and Jan Struther, author of the best-selling "Mrs. Miniver" and other books, will be the guest experts, serving with the American-born regulars, John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams. It will be Miss Struther's eighth turn on the experts' panel.

Musical variety will be the keynote of the concert Friday, at 8 p. m. over WEAF, when the cast presents selections ranging from Handel's "Largo" to "Give a Little Whistle" from "Pinocchio."

Lucille Manners is to sing Dvorak's "Songs My Mother Taught Me" as well as the Handel aria; Baritone Ross Graham will offer "Song of the Vagabonds" by Friml, and the orchestra will play "Green Eyes" by Menendez. The ensemble opens the program with the "Pinocchio" number and concludes with Harling's "Beyond the Blue Horizon."

JOB SERVICES TO BE EXPANDED IN 23 COUNTIES

COLUMBUS, O., March 6 — (AP) — The U. S. Employment Service prepared today to recruit 250,000 agricultural and industrial workers and ordered part-time offices in 23 counties placed on a full-time basis this spring.

Wade Hammond, state director, said the office's 68 field units would continue full-time operation.

Additional office workers will be hired, he asserted, after 262,000 of the state farmers answer questionnaires concerning labor needs this season.

Counties where offices will go on a full-time basis are: Madison, Fulton, Henry, Paulding, Putnam, Auglaize, Mercer, Darke, Champaign, Preble, Greene, Warren, Clermont, Brown, Highland, Union, Delaware, Pickaway, Jackson, Morrow, Medina, Harrison and Perry.
