

Madeleine Carroll Will Be Heard On Monday Night Hour

"The Age Of Innocence" To Be Aired At 7:30 P. M. Via WEA F; History And Background Of Flag Will Be Told

Beautiful Madeleine Carroll has been cast in a role for the American radio audience that won the acclaim of 207 Broadway audiences for another great actress, Katherine Cornell, 13 years ago. The play starring Miss Carroll, a dramatization by Margaret Ayer Barnes of Edith Wharton's "The Age of Innocence", will be presented on the "Cavalade of America" broadcast of Monday, at 7:30 over WEA F.

President Roosevelt, Vice-President Henry A. Wallace and Secretary of Agriculture Claude Wickard will speak Monday from 9:45 p. m. to 10 p. m., over WEA F on "The Farmers' Part in the War Effort."

The broadcast will take place on the anniversary of President Roosevelt's action in 1933 of calling agricultural leaders to Washington for conferences which formulated the administration's farm program.

The Carnation Chorus will contribute "America, The Beautiful," "You're A Grand Old Flag" and a medley of "Marines' Hymn," "Anchors Aweigh" and "Caissons Song."

Margaret Speaks, prima donna of the "Voice of Firestone," will range from a Puccini aria to a song by Noel Coward on the program Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEA F.

The soprano is to sing "Mi Chiamano Mimi" from Puccini's "La Boheme"; Coward's "I'll Follow My Secret Heart," "Kerry Dance," by Molloy, and "Just a Little Love, a Little Kiss," by Silesu.

The "Telephone Hour" will turn the spotlight on a variety of familiar favorites Monday, including music by Brahms, Fritzl and Ethelbert Nevin at 8 p. m. over WEA F.

James Melton's tenor solos are to be "Siboney" by Lecuona and Guion's "Home On the Range;" Francis White will lend her voice to "Indian Love Call" from Fritzl's "Rose Marie," and the two will sing the duet from Gounod's "Faust."
