

# Kay Kyser And His Crew To Offer Broadcast From East

"College Of Musical Knowledge" Moves To Gotham; Famous Author's Young Daughter Will Be With Quiz Kids

In their first broadcast from New York in many months, Prof. Kay Kyser and his "College of Musical Knowledge" crew will swing out Wednesday at 10 p. m. over WEAf. The hour-long quiz musicale will open with the "Man from the South" who might be the professor himself. Tenor Harry Babbitt is down for "When the Roses Bloom Again" and Dorothy Dunn will go sentimental with "I Don't Want To Walk Without You, Baby."

Kyser's extra-special treatment of "Deep in the Heart of Texas" calls on the entire ensemble and gets the production spotlight, while Sully Mason licks his chops over "Short'nin' Bread." "Rose O'Day" is slated for the trio, and Harry and Dorothy share the words of "Who Wouldn't Love You?". Other orchestral highspots include "Jersey Bounce," a new novelty, "Be Honest With Me" and "Moonlight Cocktail."
