

# "Northwest Mounted Police" On Radio Theatre Program

Gary Cooper Will Be Starred In Saga Of Canadian Woods; Richard Crooks To Offer Four Numbers

Gary Cooper, winner of an Academy award for giving the best screen performance of any actor in 1941, will return to the Radio theatre Monday at 9 p. m. over WABC to star in Cecil B. DeMille's adaptation of his film epic "Northwest Mounted Police," a saga of the gendarmes of Canada's north woods.

Cooper will play his film role of Dusty Rivers, a hard-ridin', fast-shootin' Texas Ranger, and Paulette Goddard will play her movie role of Loupette Corbeau, bewitching half-breed firebrand.

A new vocal arrangement of Kettelby's popular "In a Monastery Garden" will be Richard Crooks' featured solo on "Voice of Firestone" Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAF. The tenor also offers "Mother Machree," "Only a Rose" and "Ay, Ay, Ay."

A musical portrait of George Gershwin will be painted on the "Carnation Contented" program, Monday at 10 p. m. over WEAF under the direction of the Conductor-composer Percy Faith.

Faith will present four soloists during the broadcast: William Miller, tenor, singing "Somebody Loves Me," and "Embraceable you;" pianist Bernard Berquist, playing the famous "Rhapsody in

Blue"; Reinhold Schmidt, basso, singing "Summertime," and Samuel Thavin, violinist, playing "Man I Love."

Tartini's stunning "Devil's Trill," originally written for solo violin, will be featured in a new arrangement by Maestro Donald Vorhees for the 37 strings of the Bell Symphonic orchestra on the "Telephone Hour," Monday at 9 p. m. over WEAF. Sharing top billing, the Ken Christie chorus offers the traditional Appalachian Mountain folk tune, "Froggie Went a-Courtin'."
