a number of one nighters.

Schubert's "Serenade" and "Home
Sweet Home" during the Ameri-
can Melody Hour at 9 p. m.

Thibault will contribute "Look
For the Silver Lining" and "Prom-
ise We'll Never Part," based on
Tschaiikowsky's Sixth Symphony;
Miss della Chiesa will sing "Ay
Ay Ay" and "Song of India."

Remo Bolognini, violin soloist,
will play "Touch of Your Hand"
and the orchestra, under the di-
rection of Dr. Frank Black, will
be heard in "Tonight We Love."
