

Physical Overhaul Planned For Barrymore On Thursday

Actor Reginald Gardiner Will Attempt Feat
During Vallee Program; Town Meeting
Set In Fort Wayne

Apparently no one ever thought about it seriously before, but screen actor, Reginald Gardiner will attempt a physical overhaul of John Barrymore on the Rudy Vallee program, Thursday at 10 p. m. over WEAf.
