New York Columnist To Be Heard At 10 P. M.  
Friday; Donald Crisp Set For Appear-

Donald Crisp, whose sterling performance in "How Green Was My Valley" won him a Motion Picture Academy award, will be guest star on "The Ontario Show," Friday, at 7 p. m. over WJZ. In addition to offering a dramatic reading Crisp will act as "straight man" to Col. Lemuel J. Stoopnagle, whose antics on the air have made him the No. 1 comedian of Canada, the Colonel already having copped honors as the United States' laugh favorite.
