Interviews with first-nighters, the overture, and the first chorus number will be aired during the Haresfoot club program over WIBA at 7:45 tonight.

"The Roll Call of the Nation," launching the War bond campaign, will be aired by WIBA at 9:30. It will include the first performance of "The Roosevelt Cantata: a Report on the State of the Nation," a cantata by Earl Robinson and Earl La Touche, who wrote "Ballad for Americans." Henry Hull will be narrator and William Hargrave will be soloist, with Bill Adams as Pres. Roosevelt's speaking voice. Ray Block's chorus and Al Goodman's orchestra will complete the cast.
