Subsequent to be heard are "The Devil and Daniel Webster," "The Old Maid and the Thief," "Tennessee's Partner," "Four Saints in Three Acts," "The Second Hurricane" and "The King's Henchman." Conductor Wallenstein also batons "America Preferred" on the same chain in the interests of war bond and stamp sales.
