

Ezra Stone Will Be On Ontario Show On

Young Actor, Now Sergeant In U. S.
Be Interviewed And Confused
Stoopnagle At 7 P. M.

Ezra Stone, one of radio's brightest young stars, will be a guest on the Ontario show, to cement good relations between the sister nations, on Friday at 7 p. m. over WEA.

Stone, a sergeant in the United States Army, will be interviewed and confused by Col. Lemuel Stoopnagle, whose broadcasts from Canada have made him one of an international favorite.

Margaret Webster, distinguished actress, director and producer of Shakespearean works, and Richard Maney, distinguished publicist of anything on Broadway that the Bard did NOT write, will square off in the medullary ring of "Information Please" Friday at 8:30 p. m. over WEA.

As always, in the other two corners are the regular brain-bruisers, Franklin P. Adams and John Kieran, with Clifton Fadiman as referee.

Music from popular shows of recent vintage will be featured billing Friday at 8 p. m. on WEA. The ensemble offers "All the Things You Are" from Jerome Kern's "Very Warm for May" and "Where Do You Travel" from the current Broadway success, "Best Foot Forward," while Lucille Manners sings "Smoke Gets in Your Eyes" from Kern's "Roberta."

Frank Munn introduces a new American song on "Waltz Time" Friday, the title is "Prairie Lullaby" and the composers are Aldrich and Borodkin. (WEA 9 p. m.)

The tenor also is to be heard in "How Do I Know It's Real?" "Full Moon." and "Sing Me a Song of the Islands." Contralto Evelyn MacGregor offers "Falling in Love with Love" and "I Remember You," and Abe Lyman's orchestra rounds out the show with "Let My Song Fill Your Heart," "I Love You Truly" and "Sleepy Lagoon."

Peanuts, popcorn and pink lemonade will be the theme of "Plantation Party," Friday at 9:30 p. m. over WEA when Whitey Ford, The Duke of Paducah, who recently fulfilled a boyhood dream by becoming part owner of a circus of his own, takes up the subject of circuses.

Musical portions of the broadcast are built around Mother's Day and include "Tie Me To Your Apron Strings Again," "Ain't She Sweet" and "Mother Machree," presented by the ensemble; "Songs My Mother Taught Me," by Basso Michael Stewart and "I Want A Girl Just Like The Girl That Married Dear Old Dad," by the Doring Sisters.
