at 9 p. m. over WEA-F.

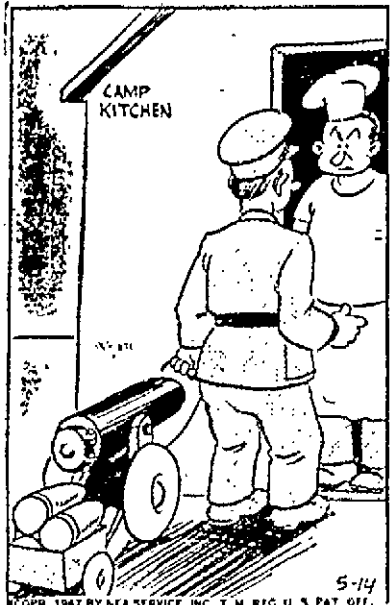
Henry Aldrich's efforts to win
