

Soloist And Yodeling Duo Set For Barn Dance Show

Smiling Ed McConnell And Dezurik Sisters Will
Be Heard As Program Takes To Air
From Home Hayloft

"The National Barn Dance" gang will be at home in the old hayloft, Saturday but comic Pat Buttram will be host in place of Joe Kelly, the regular M. C., who is on vacation. Guests expected are Smiling Ed McConnell, the singing philosopher, and the Dezurik Sisters, yodeling duo.

Lieut. Comdr. Eddie Peabody will offer "Down Home Rag" and "Tea For Two" as banjo highlights of the broadcast at 9 p. m. over WEAJ. Jane Kaye is to sing "I Remember You", Joe Parsons will do "Wagon Wheels," and Bob Ballantine's harmonica will be heard in "Zampa Overture."

The Hoosier Hot Shots and the Dinning Sisters are to harmonize on "High Cost of Lovin'" and "I Dood It," respectively.

"Prayer for Poland," based on Chopin's "Raindrop Prelude" and arranged by the singer himself; Puccini's aria, "Che Gelida Manina" from "La Boheme," "Polish Dance" by Wieniawski and "La Reve" from Massenet's "Manon."
