Earl Oxford of Fort Bragg, N. C.,
who was a musical comedy singer
before he entered the United
States Army, is the sixth and final
"Singer in uniform" to appear on
the "Hour of Charm." He will be
heard with Phil Spitalny's all-girl
orchestra and choir on the program
to be broadcast on Sunday, at 10
p. m., over WEA from an un-
disclosed point on the eastern sea-
board Bill Stern, sports reporter,
will broadcast an eye-witness de-
