

Top Radio Stars Volunteer To Help War Messages In Broadcast Series on WIBA

Radio's top-ranking stars will be presented in Victory Parade, a series of Sunday broadcasts which will begin at 8 tonight over WIBA. The program will be produced in cooperation with the Office of Facts and Figures, with stars, writers, directors, advertisers, and agencies volunteering their service to provide a medium for carrying government messages vital to the war effort.

Tonight's stars will include Fannie "Baby Snooks" Brice, Frank Morgan, John Conte, and Meredith Willson's orchestra. On succeeding Sundays, the talent will include the cast of Mr. District Attorney, Jack Benny, Fibber McGee and Molly, Bob Hope, Burns and Allen, and the Aldrich Family.

Another new series on WIBA today will be We Believe, to be offered at 3:30 p. m. Embracing all religious faiths, the series will present Dr. Frank Black, conductor; a concert orchestra, choir, soloists, and narrator. Today's music will include "Holy, Holy, Holy," "Adoro Te Devote," "The Torch of Israel," the Bach-Gounod "Ave Maria," "Nearer My God to Thee," "Halaluyoh," and "America the Beautiful."
