Theodore And Franklin Will Be Honored On
Radio Shows; Margaret Speaks To Feature
"Liebestraum" On Program

Cavalcade of America, on the air at 8 p. m. Monday over WEAJ, will present Walter Huston in "The Colossus of Panama," air portrait of William Gorgas, scientist, who believed with President Roosevelt that a canal across the jungle of Panama was America's necessary defense against Japan.

Ceremonies at which President Roosevelt will be presented with the "Church Award of 1942" will be broadcast over WLW Monday at 10:30 p. m. The speaker for the occasion will be Vice-President Wallace discussing "The Destiny of the Hemisphere in World Affairs." Mr. Wallace's address will be heard from the banquet room of the Waldorf-Astoria hotel.
