Hazleton, Pa., Woman Will Describe Art; "June Bride Adventure" Is Title Of Ellery Queen Mystery

Perched at a vantage point along the line of march, announcers will give a graphic word-picture of event, beginning at 11:00 a. m., and ending at 7:30 p. m. The third pick-up will be made during the afternoon, at 4:45 p. m.
