

Indian Chiefs Declare War On Axis On "We The People"

Redskins Take Official Step In Retaliation To Nazi Claims; Program To Be Broadcast To Occupied Countries

Six Indian Chiefs, representing the Oneida, Seneca, Tuscarora, Mohawk and Cayuga tribes, will officially declare war on the Axis over "We, the People" during the broadcast Sunday, over WABC at 7:30 p. m. This portion of the broadcast will originate from Washington, D. C.

The various tribes have heretofore refused to recognize the United States in an official manner. They have also protested against the draft. As a result, Nazi officials publicized the fact that American Indians did not want to go to war. Therefore, the broadcast will be recorded by the British Broadcasting Company and short-waved to the occupied countries.
