### HOT WEATHER STORY

**CAIRO, Egypt, June 20—(AP)**  
—The Berlin radio claim that  
Nazis were using refrigerated  
tanks in the Libyan desert was  
labeled "a hot weather story" by  
British armored vehicle officers  
today. The same story circulated  
in Egypt last summer, they said,  
and recurs every time the tem-  
perature reaches 120 degrees. Cap-  
tured German tanks, the officers  
said, have fans but no refrigeration  
plants.
