Joan Banks Plays Return Engagement On "Manhattan At Midnight;" Problem Of Copper To Be Told

Eddie Anderson, Jack Benny's "Rochester," takes a busman's holiday during his boss' absence from the airwaves and pays a visit to Eddie Cantor's "Time to Smile" broadcast Wednesday at 9 p. m. over WEAJ.

This broadcast, which will originate at the U. S. Marine barracks, San Diego, Calif., marks the Banjo-Eyed comedian's farewell for the summer. While Eddie vacations the Wednesday night spot will be taken over by Agnes Ridge-way's romantic drama series, "Those We Love," featuring Francis X. Bushman, Nan Grey, Richard Cromwell, Helen Wood, Alma Kruger and Donald Woods.

The "Time to Smile" cast, for its farewell, has enlisted the aid of Rochester to help pack for the get-away. Since the dusky valet performed the same duties recently for Jack Benny, Cantor thinks Rochester can do the same for him, and most economically.

Joan Banks, pulchritudinous and able, again will play a return one-night-stand for the "Manhattan at Midnight" series when she co-stars with Dick Widmark, also in a return engagement, in "Our Love" on Wednesday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ. The drama, enacted by only two characters, is the tale of John and Mary Smith, little people in a big city. The Smiths are the New Yorkers who go to Coney Island on a Sunday, to a job each morning, and spend their evenings at a movie or walking in the park.

UNCLE SAM TO PAY \$184 TO EQUIP WOMEN

WASHINGTON, June 24 — (AP) — Here's what it will cost Uncle Sam to dress his WAACS—the ladies soon to join the army's auxiliary corps.

They'll get an initial clothing allowance of \$184.91, plus a maintenance allowance of \$70.77.

One item of the women's bill, \$10 a pair for gloves, was described by Rep. Mahon (D-Tex.), as "outrageous."

Major General E. B. Gregory of the quartermaster corps assured the committee that only a "limited number" of that type would be provided.

The figures were disclosed by the house appropriations committee in sending to the floor a bill for funds for the army for 1943.

REGISTRATION DATES ARE SET IN PUTNAM-CO

OTTAWA, June 24 — Another group of Putnam-co youths will be registered June 27 and 30.

This registration is for males born on or after Jan. 1, 1922, and on or before June 1, 1924. The registration will be conducted at the selective service board's headquarters in the courthouse here only. There will be no community registration headquarters set up thruout the county as in previous sign-ups, the officials explained.

On Saturday, June 27, the registration will be conducted from noon to 6 p. m. while on Tuesday June 30, it will take place from 7 a. m. to 9 p. m. Volunteer workers will assist the draft board in registering these youths.

While the boys who register this time will not be eligible for military drafting under the selective service act, it may stand
