## KITCHEN COURSE TO BE OFFERED DISTRICT WOMEN

The nutrition committee of the Allen-co Civilian Defense Council Friday announced plans for a "Kitchen Course in Nutrition" to be offered to the women of Lima and Allen-co.

Object of the course is to give housewives an opportunity to learn the best way to operate their kitchens in war time and maintain the health and efficiency of their families.

The course will cover the field of nutrition and the wise buying of food and the information will be practical and the kind that housewives can take home and use. There will be 10 lessons, with some outside reading and when the course is properly completed, a certificate will be awarded.

This course was originally tried out in California with considerable success. It is highly recommended by the Ohio State Consumers' Interest Committee.

Mrs. W. E. Bayly was named chairman of the local arrangements for the course. Further details will be announced as plans are completed.
