Wilkie, Republican candidate for president in 1940, will be the principal speaker and Clifton Fadiman of Information Please will be master of ceremonies when the name of Czechoslovakia's Lidice is conferred upon an Illinois community of war industry workers in a special broadcast at 4:30 p. m. today over WIBA.

Lidice, Czechoslovakia, was razed and all occupants either slain or sent to concentration camps by the German Gestapo on June 10 in revenge for the assassination of Heinrich "Hangman" Heydrich.

The new Lidice was an open field three months ago. Today, it is home for a group of workers in war industries in or near Joliet. Residents voted to name their new community after the Czech town.
