

to Discuss Defense Areas

The problem to how to deal with wartime conditions in defense areas will be discussed at length on America's Town Meeting of the Air, to be broadcast at 8 tonight over WENR.

The topic will be divided into two parts, defense housing and the health and general welfare of the populations displaced by defense work. Among the speakers will be Richard Neustadt, director of the Office of Defense Health and Welfare of the 12th region, and Peter Grimm, director of the Citizens' Housing council.

Neustadt will point out how, and to what extent, the federal government can provide health services in defense areas when the community and local governments cannot afford the necessary facilities.
