

Service Heroes To Be Guests On "Lone Ranger" Broadcasts

Hits From Four Film Editions Of "Broadway Melody" Get Feature Billing; Dramatic Mystery Scheduled

Some of America's greatest heroes of the war will be heard as guests on "The Lone Ranger" program in a series of interviews in connection with "The Lone Ranger Victory Corps," a nationwide group of youngsters organized to help win the war on the home front. First of the interviews will take place on Friday at 7:30 p. m. over WJZ.

Six interviews have been arranged thus far. Appearing on the July 17th program will be Lieutenant Elliott Vandevanter, who was awarded the Distin-

guished Flying Cross for his part in a raid on a Japanese landing.

Hits from the four film editions of "Broadway Melody" get featured billing on the "Cities Service Concert" Friday at 8 p. m. over WEAJ. Lucille Manners, Ross Graham, the chorus and orchestra recall "You Were Meant for Me," "Singing in the Rain," "Broadway Melody," "Broadway Rhythm" and "I've Got My Eyes on You."

"The Case of the Lady-fingered Killer" will be presented by "Gang Busters" on Friday at 9 p. m. over WJZ. The dramatic chase of the man who killed a policeman trying to arrest him will be followed out closely.

How the killer finally was traced thru a stolen draft card which he dropped in the chase, and how a case of oranges led to his arrest, will be enacted by the talented cast of actors.

William P. Witherow, president of the National Assn of Manufac-

turers, will be heard as guest speaker on the "Men, Machines—Victory" broadcast over the nationwide WJZ. John W. Vandercok, noted news analyst, also will be heard as narrator of the broadcast.

Mrs. Walter Lippmann, national director of Red Cross Volunteer Nurses' Aid Corps and wife of the well-known newspaper columnist, will be the guest of the Red Cross-General Mills "Thus We Live" program to be heard over WABC Friday from 9:45 to 10 a. m.
