Cecil B. DeMille presents Cary Grant, Katharine Hepburn, Lieut. James Stewart and Virginia Weidler in "Philadelphia Story" in the Inaugural program of the summer Victory theatre series Monday at 9 p. m. over WABC.

"Philadelphia Story" was one of Broadway's Pulitzer price winners. Later, it established many new records as a movie, with Grant, Miss Hepburn, Stewart and Virginia Weidler in the leading roles.

Raymond Crisara, twenty-one-year-old native of Cortland, N.
