

Metropolitan Star Heard On Wednesday

Alexander Sved To Rejoin Jean Tennyson
Broadcast Of "Great Moments In Music"
Program At 10 P. M.

Alexander Sved, Metropolitan Opera Company, whom Jean Tennyson made her first concert abroad, will rejoin the lovely star of "Great Moments In Music" as a special guest when the program excerpts from Franz Lehar's "The Merry Widow" on the WABC network Wednesday at 10 p. m. Jan. 15. Sved will sing the tenor role, as is customary, and George Sebastian will conduct the orchestra and chorus.

Sved's appearance with Miss Tennyson will be in the nature of a homecoming for both of them, since the scene of the Lehar operetta is Vienna, which was also their first meeting place. Miss Tennyson and Sved also had successful concerts in Budapest and other continental cities.

Sved's appearance follows the program's policy of bringing great operatic voices to sing great operetta roles. The Hungarian baritone was born in Budapest and made his debut there in the Royal Opera at the age of 22. He became a leading member of opera companies in Vienna, Munich, London, Buenos Aires and Rio de Janeiro. In addition he was a successful film player in foreign made pictures and a popular recording artist.

"The Case of the Sweetest Story Ever Told," dealing with the sugar shortage will be dramatized on the "Mr. District Attorney" program at 9:30 p. m. over WEAF.

The script, penned by Jerry Devine and Ed Byron originally was scheduled for the July 15 broadcast but was postponed. Mood music for "Mr. District Attorney" is composed by Peter Van Steeden.

"The Murder At Three Elms", a drama by George Barraud, will be presented during the "Manhattan at Midnight" series, at 8:30 p. m., over the WJZ network.

Following is a memorandum from author George Barraud to Joe Hill, director of the "Manhattan" program:

"The bare bones of this story were told to me in England about 25 years ago. It was alleged to be a true story, the strange adventure having befallen a friend or relative of my informant. The story stopped at the point where Joan saw the ghostly murderer for the second time.

"It is possible that a similar

story has been told before; but if it is true, read it."
