Minor, Mendelssohn's "Son and
Stranger", and Friml's "Indian
Love Call" in a special Spitalny
arrangement. Joseph Gingold, con-
cert and radio violinist, will com-
plete the program with "Caprice
Viennois" by Kreisler.
