Secretary of State Cordell Hull will address the nation tonight at 8:30 over WIBA and other stations.

In announcing Hull would speak, Pres. Roosevelt said the cabinet official will try to drive home to the American people the seriousness of the war.

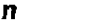

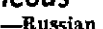

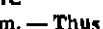
