

'Meet Your Navy' Program To Offer Good Entertainment

"Phantom Killer" Starts New Scripts Friday Night; Coral Sea Hero Scheduled To Appear As Guest Star

One of the most professional casts in its career will be featured on "Meet Your Navy," the bluejackets' own show, when it is heard at 10 p. m. Friday over WJZ. Heading the cast will be William Hudson, 28, former motion picture actor and staff baritone of Cincinnati. He is a naval recruit from Norwood, and will give an imitation of Rudy Vallee impersonating Phil Harris, Morton Downey, Little Jack Little and, of all people, William Hudson.

Sebert Willett, 20, of Charlotte, Mich., will be heard singing the rhythmic spiritual, "Deep River," and Charles Tomlinson, 22, former night club artist of Louisville, Ky., will offer a whistling specialty of "Elmer's Tune." By way of contrast, Don Paulson of Winnetka, Ill., the show's one amateur, lends the first classic note to the Navy program with an offering of Lecuona's popular "Malaguena."

Gayler, who received the Navy Cross and Gold Star for his brave deeds during the Coral Sea battle, will be interviewed by Joan Harding on the "Men of the Sea" program Friday, at 9:45 p. m. over WJZ. Lieutenant Gayler was a naval aviator attached to the aircraft carrier Lexington, which figured so prominently in the battle. He is now a chief test pilot.

wife joins the army will be considered by Whitey Ford, (the Duke of Paducah) on the "Plantation Party," program Friday at 9:30 p. m. over WEAJ.

The Caravah Hour over WABC Friday, at 10 p. m. will bring to the air Connie Boswell in two captivating numbers — "This Is Worth Fighting For" and "Sweet Eloise." Lanny Ross, tenor emcee of the hour-long program, will also be featured as will Xavier Cugat, leading exponent of Latin-American rhythms in this country, with more of his authentic interpretations of music from "below the border." Dramatic sketches will consist in another episode of the radio version of Thornton Wilder's stage success, "Our Town," and a skit by Margo. Comedian Herb Shriner will make the third transcontinental broadcast of his career.
