Maj. Alexander P. de Seversky, aeronautical expert and author, will begin a Saturday "War in the Air" series tonight at 6:45 over WIBA. The programs are designed to present to the public an analysis and informative resume of air warfare on the various battlefronts.

The noted airplane designer, manufacturer of aircraft, and pilot has appeared frequently in the pages of The Wisconsin State Journal as author of aeronautical articles.

Maj. de Seversky believes that final victory of the United Nations will come through air power with public opinion being important in hastening that hour, and he said:

"It is in the hope of contributing a little to the process of general aeronautical enlightenment that I undertake the broadcasting assignment."
