

Chief Of U. S. Air Force In Near East To Be On Program

Major General Lewis Hyde Brereton To Tell Of Vital Role Being Played By Yankee Bombers And Fighters In Egypt

Major General Lewis Hyde Brereton, commander of United States Air Forces in the middle east, makes a special appearance on the March of Time at 10:30 p. m., Thursday, over WEAF, speaking by direct radio from Cairo. Recently transferred from his post as chief of American aviation in India and a veteran of the air wars over the Philippines, Java and Burma, Gen. Brereton will reveal the vital role being played by U. S. bombers and fighter in the Battle of Egypt.

Edward Everett Horton and Gorge Raft of the film colony, Colonel D. M. Randall of the U. S. Marine Corps and the colonel's son, Lieut. Stewart Randall, who has just been graduated from the Marine Officers Training school, will be Bob Crosby's guests in the Music Hall Thursday, at 9:00 p. m. over WEAF.

Capt. James M. Irish, supervisor of shipbuilding in New York, the man in charge of all new construction outside of the Brooklyn Navy Yard, is to be guest speaker on "Engineers at War" Thursday at 6:30 p. m. over WEAF, speaking on "The Navy Ships."

The nature of "The Role of the Press in Wartime" will be discussed by three newspaper publishers, and Eric Johnston, president of the United States

Chamber of Commerce, when "America's Town Meeting of the Air" is broadcast over WJZ Thursday at 9 p. m.

The publishers will be Gardner Cowles, Jr., assistant director for domestic operations of the OWF; and publisher of the Des Moines Register and Tribune, Des Moines, Ia.; Palmer Hoyt, of the Oregonian, Portland, Oregon, and Sol Lewis, of the Lynden Tribune, Lynden, Wash.

Bob Kluney, vice president of Local 43 of the Industrial Union of Marine and Shipbuilding Workers of America, will be guest of the Red Cross radio program, "Thus We Live" to be heard over WABC at 9:45 p. m. Thursday.

Formerly a seaman and now a first class machinist in the Bethlehem-Fairfield shipyards in Baltimore, Md., Kluney will tell about the spirit of the shipbuilders' unions in their all-out effort to win the war. He will be interviewed by Arch McDonald, well-known Washington announcer and Red Cross Reporter.
