have the stellar roles in the series. A special musical treat is in store for listeners to the 8 p. m. WABC program at which time Nelson Eddy and Nadine Conner will sing "Bess, You Is My Woman," from George Gershwin's Negro folk opera "Porgy and Bess," currently enjoying a sumptuous revival on Broadway.

Eddy has chosen a balanced group of humorous and serious solos. He will sing the ever-popular "At Dawning," by Charles Wakefield Cadman; "Waltzing Matilda," by Marie Cowan and A. B. Patterson; "A Policeman's Lot Is Not a Happy One," from "The Pirates of Penzance," by Gilbert and Sullivan; "Gypsy Love Song," from "The Fortune Teller," by Victor Herbert and "Roadways," by John Denmore.

Nadine Conner will be heard in a solo and the chorus of eight men and four women will join her and Eddy in certain of the songs. Robert Armbruster's Orchestra provides the accompaniments and Bob Garred handles the announcing stint.

Second Lieut. George Welch, young army flier who shot down four Jap planes during the Dec. 7 attack on Pearl Harbor, will be interviewed on the Lone Ranger program at 7:30 p. m. over the WJZ network.

During the program, he will describe some of his war experiences and will address a special message to the youngsters of America.

When the Jap planes first appeared over Pearl Harbor, Welch took off to attack without knowing the size of the enemy force. With only one other pursuit plane, he attacked a squadron of twelve Jap planes, knocking out a dive bomber before his guns jammed. He went into a climb, checked his guns and swooped down to destroy another Jap before returning to his base. Later, he bagged two more.
