

Blow-Torch Barber, Of Refugee Kids Se

One Of Strangest Of Court Mysteries
Dramatized On "Famous Jury Trials"
Program

An optometrist from Oklahoma City, termed "Blow-Torch Barber" will shave himself with a blow-torch when he appears as a guest star on "Hobby Lobby," Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ. The other interesting hobbyists scheduled are a woman who risks her life in helping refugee children; a woman author who collects ancient and modern weapons; a teen-age farm boy who builds spinning wheels; a comedian who collects and plays strange harmonicas.

One of the strangest of court mysteries, which began when Leo Dubin, filling station proprietor, was murdered during a robbery will be dramatized during "Famous Jury Trials," Tuesday at 9 p. m. over WZ.
