

Mrs. Morgenthau To Appear On Radio War Stamp Drive

Secretary's Wife Will Interview Alma Kitchell On
Weekly 15-Minute Spot On Blue
Network

Mrs. Henry Morgenthau, Jr., wife of the Secretary of the Treasury, will participate in Alma Kitchell's weekly broadcast on Wednesday, Sept. 2, when a new War Savings Stamp campaign is launched over the Blue network.

The campaign, which has been approved by the Treasury Department's War Savings Staff, to inspire mothers of service men to buy a War Savings Stamp each day for their sons in the armed forces, was first suggested by Mrs. Kitchell, Blue network's women's specialist.

Mrs. Morgenthau, who will be heard from 12:00 noon to 12:15 p. m., EWT, will interview Mrs. Kitchell on her idea for "A Stamp A Day For the Son Who's Away."

Lieut. Irvin McPherson, who piloted a Navy plane thru the rain of anti-aircraft fire in the Midway battle, will be interviewed on the Lone Ranger program at 7:30 p. m., over the Blue network. He will urge the youth of America to help fight the war on the home front. Lieut. McPherson's radio operator reported that a torpedo dropped by McPherson scored a

direct hit on a Jap aircraft carrier of the Hago class.
