

# "What Price Victory" Is Topic For Town Meeting

Three Harvard Professors And One Student To Participate; One Heads Board Of Joint Economic Warfare

"What Price Victory?" a consideration of the sacrifices all Americans will have to make to crush the enemy, will be discussed on "America's Town Meeting of the Air," broadcast from the Saunders theatre on the Harvard university campus, Thursday at 9 p. m. via WJZ.

The speakers will be Dr. Alvin H. Hansen, professor of political economy at Harvard, now on leave to take the post of chairman of the Board of Joint Economic Warfare, and special economic adviser to the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System; Dr. William E. Hocking, chairman of the Department of Philosophy at Harvard; Dr. Crane Brinton, of the Department of History at Harvard; Thomas Matters, a senior student majoring in government and president of the Student Council.

In one of the finest cast line-ups of the season, Ethel Barrymore, Gertrude Niesen and Georgie Jessel will be presented in the Stage Door Canteen Thursday at 9:30 p. m. over WABC. Raymond Paige's orchestra will be heard, with Bert Lytell acting as emcee.
