

Victor Herbert Waltzes Will Be Heard Friday Night

Medley Of Old Favorites Will Be Offered By
Frank Black, Along With Songs By
Lucille Manners

Old-time Victor Herbert waltz favorites will sparkle anew on Friday when Dr. Frank Black conducts the "Cities Service Concert", ensemble in a medley featuring "Kiss Me Again," "Falling in Love With Someone," "A Kiss in the Dark," "Ask Her While the Band is Playing" and "When You're Away" at 8 p. m. over WEAJ.

The musical menu includes two soprano solos by Lucille Manners—"Il Est Doux, Il Est Bon" from Massenet's "Herodiade" and "Ill See You Again" from Noel Coward's "Bitter Sweet." Baritone Ross Graham offers Schubert's "Who Is Sylvia?", the ensemble will be heard in "Sing, My Heart" from the film "Love Affair," and the orchestra will round out the broadcast with Gliere's "Dance of the Russian Sailors."
