Jan Peerce will sing, "Come Where My Love Lies Dreaming," and will be joined by Jean Tennyson for one of the most melodic Foster melodies, "Linger in Blissful Repose." Miss Tennyson will sing "Beautiful Dreamer" and "Old Folks at Home." Robert Weede will sing "Old Lemuel," and the de Faur Chorus will be heard in a medley of other Foster songs.

Henry Wilson, whose amazing story will be unfolded during the "Manhattan at Midnight" dramatization at 8:30 p. m. over the WJZ network, once was just an average guy.

He was a senior clerk in an office at a salary of \$40 a week. Wilson lived with his sister, Harriet, and her husband, who was allergic to work.

On the morning of the day which changed his life, Henry Wilson, in the rear seat of a bus, noticed a small brown manila envelope on the floor. When he opened it he found bills of such large denominations that he had to count the zeros on his fingers.

Too dazed to stick on regular routine, Wilson had two straight whiskeys before going to his office. Sudden wealth opened new vistas to the senior clerk. He noticed for the first time that his boss's secretary was beautiful and he demanded an interview with his boss who never saw anyone before 10 a. m.

Telling his employer that the 17 years he had worked for him were the dreariest of his life, Wilson concluded by saying he was sick of the office, sick of the job, and very, very sick of his boss.

Reaching home again, after being made a member of the firm and invited to have a drink with his astonished boss, Wilson carved out a few rules which he wanted his sister and in-laws to follow.

Actress Laurene Tuttle in one single minute literally journeyed from the ridiculous to the sublime. Finishing her role as Niece Marjorie on "The Great Gildersleeve" program, she dashed down

the corridor to another NBC studio.

Sixty seconds later she was in the cast of the new Lionel Barrymore show, "Mayor of the Town," playing the tragic role of a young Navy wife whose husband was killed in the Battle of the Coral Sea.

That 60-second dash proved the test of an actress.

In the Gildersleeve show Miss Tuttle had the audience rocking with laughter. In the Barrymore show, her sincere portrayal of a young war widow brought handkerchiefs to the eyes of many in the audience.
