Orson, Wonder Boy Of Stage, Hits Guest Spot
After Many Invitations; Kate Smith Hour
Returns To WABC

Orson Welles, Wonder Boy of stage, screen and radio, apparently never has been afraid of anything in the world but "Information Please." At long last, he has screwed up his courage to the breaking point and is going to look Quizmaster Clifton Fadiman in the eye at the session Friday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAF. He had been invited time and again, since the program began more than four years ago, but until now has always shivered and said "No, thanks."

Supporting Welles on the board of experts will be Christopher Morley, novelist up for his sixteenth time, and Anchor Men John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams.

"Those Good Old Days," Bill Hardey's musical history of the Gay Nineties heard over WJZ every Friday at 8:30 p. m., will throw the spotlight on none other than the famous English music hall star, Cecilia Loftus. She will do the uncanny imitations of the great and near-great of the past which won her international fame.
