## Police Right to See Draft Card Limited

MILWAUKEE (U.P.)—Municipal Judge Max W. Nohl ruled Saturday that a man is not required by law to divulge his name or exhibit his draft registration card to a police officer if he has not been involved in a breach of the peace.

Judge Nohl made this finding in dismissing a disorderly conduct charge against Alfred Hirsh, 34, editor of the Wisconsin CIO News. The case came before Judge Nohl on an appeal from a district court decision in which Judge A. J. Hedding fined Hirsh \$1 on Aug. 17.

The court denied a similar appeal brought by Emil Costello, national representative of the CIO United Steel Workers Union of America, and upheld the lower court's fine and finding that he was guilty of disorderly conduct. Costello formerly represented a Kenosha county district in the
