

Stoughton Farm Will Be Scene of Broadcast

Army Hour Show Carried at 2:30; Benny Returns

A farm near Stoughton will be the scene of one of the pickups used by the Army Hour at 2:30 p. m. today on WIBA, in a program demonstrating the vital role of food in the war effort.

One other farm, located near Greeley, Colo., will be used in the broadcast. Three pickups from army camps will bring broadcasts of soldiers at breakfast, lunch, and dinner, the latter from overseas. Other pickups will be made in Chicago, at spots where army food is purchased, processed, stored, and tested. A cooking demonstration will come from Ft. Totten, N. Y.

Another WIBA highlight today will be the return of Jack Benny's show at 6 tonight, with Mary Livingston, Don Wilson, Dennis Day, Phil Harris, and Rochester on deck.

Sport fans will have two big time offerings today, the fourth game of the world series coming from Yankee Stadium on WGN at 12:45 p. m., and the Packers-Chicago Cardinals football game broadcast from Comiskey park, Chicago, at 8:30 tonight on WTMJ.
