

FDR to Open Chests' Drive in Radio Program Tonight

Pres. Roosevelt will open the nation's War and Community Chest annual campaign in a broadcast to be carried on WIBA, WIBU, and all major networks tonight from 9:30 to 10.

The president will ask \$170,000,000, to be raised in 625 cities for Community and War Chests, including the United Service organization, and relief organizations for China, Britain, Holland, Russia, and Greece, war prisoners' recreation, and social hygiene programs in defense areas.

Joseph C. Ford, Madison War Chest campaign chairman, and Frank A. Ross, War Chest general chairman, will speak over stations WIBA and WIBU, respectively, during the program.

The network program also will include a special production of the radio serial, "Blondie," and a short concert by the Philadelphia orchestra. The program cancels the regular "Blondie" broadcast heard on WBBM at the same hour.
