The Army hour will commemorate the 450th anniversary of the discovery of America during its broadcast over WIBA at 2:30 p. m. today.

Guest speakers will be Lieut. Gen. Stanley D. Embick, chairman of the inter-American defense board, and Vice Admiral Albert W. Johnson, a board member.

Other features will include interviews with Latin American officers training in the United States, pickups from Mitchell field, the Army Air Forces Radio school in Chicago, and two overseas communications points, and a demonstration of the "eyes of the artillery."
