

Tribute to Victims of Nazis Shares Honors with Airwomen

A tribute to the memory of Lidice, Czech village exterminated by the Nazis, and the story of the U. S. women's auxiliary ferrying squadron will highlight the Army hour at 2:30 p. m. today on WIBA.

A native of Lidice, Ladislav Kiml, now a Cleveland resident, will describe the picturesque village before it was ruthlessly destroyed. Broadcast plans also call for interviews with prominent women pilots—Louise Thade, Helen Ritchie, and Betty Lund.

The Army hour will move to West Point, where a demonstration of the new cadet assault course will be heard, then shift to Ft. Belvoir, Va., and finally to the Brazos river, Texas, where the army will demonstrate its demolition methods in blowing up a 240-foot steel bridge. Other features will be broadcasts by the armored forces, air forces, and paratroops.

On another front today, the Chicago Bears football team will tackle the New York Giants, and the Packers mix with the Rams. The Bears-Giants game will be carried by WENR at 2:25; the Packers-Rams tussle on WTMJ at 1:56 p. m.

Here today the victorious University of Wisconsin football team will arrive at the Milwaukee road West side station for a big welcome. WIBA will carry the homecoming at 12:15 p. m.
